Once upon a time, there was a Gingerbread Prince. He lived in the Gingerbread Castle with his mom and dad, the King and Queen.

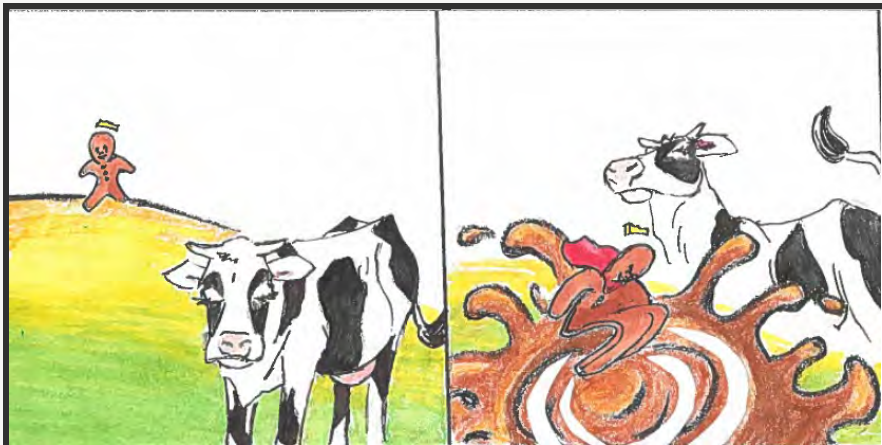

One day, without telling the Queen where he was going, the Gingerbread Prince dashed out of the Gingerbread Castle. He was in a naughty mood, and off he ran.

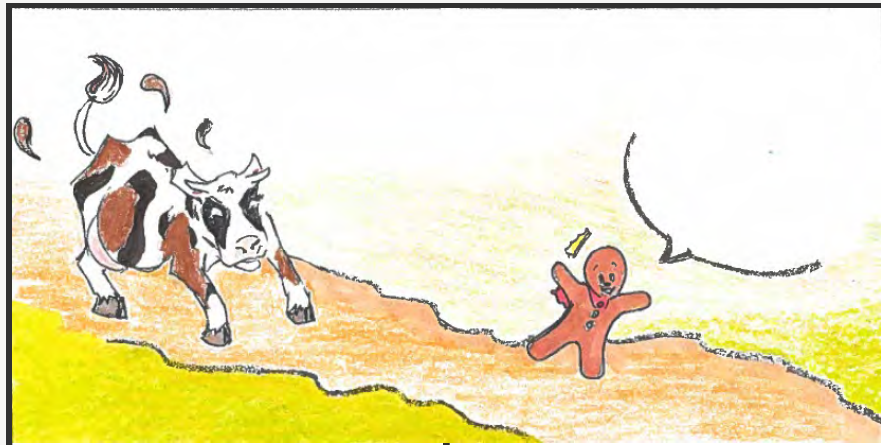

THE GINGERBREAD PRINCE

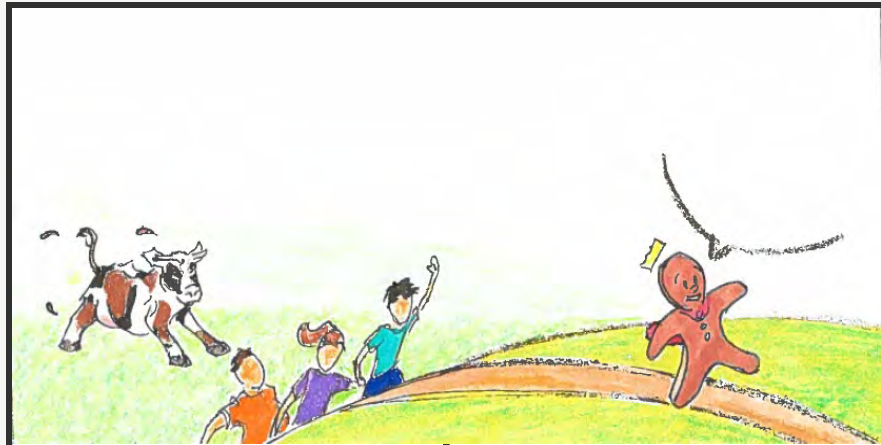
Pgs 9-10

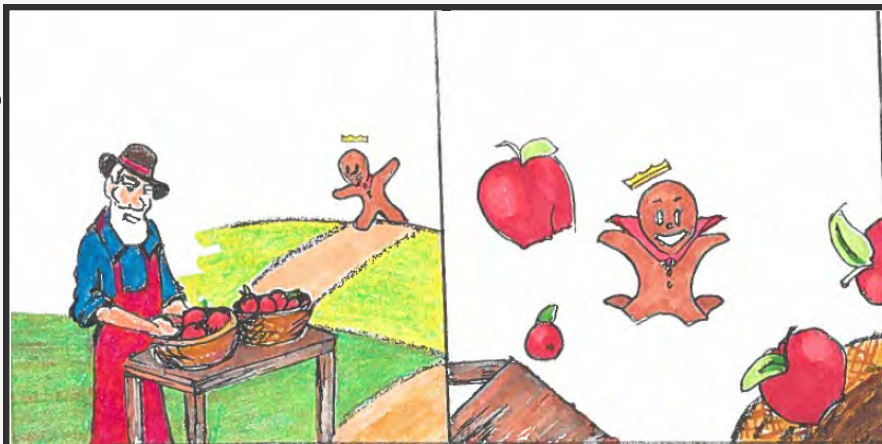


The kids were so upset that they yelled and ran after the Prince. But the Prince just laughed and ran away singing,

The kids and the cow chased after him.

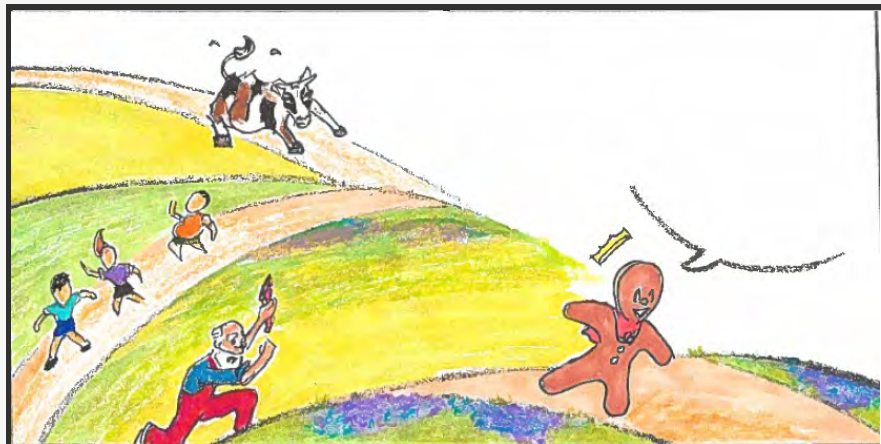
Pgs 13-14

"I jump and hop and knock things down,

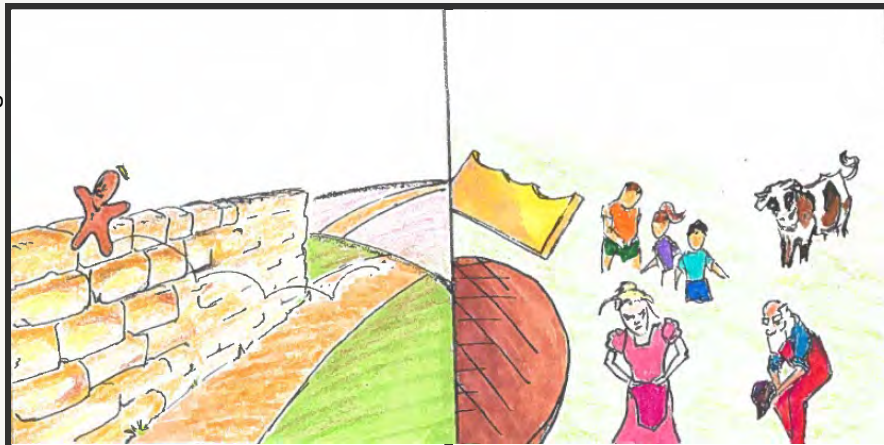
I am the funniest boy in town.

The girl, the old man, the kids, and the cow chased after him.

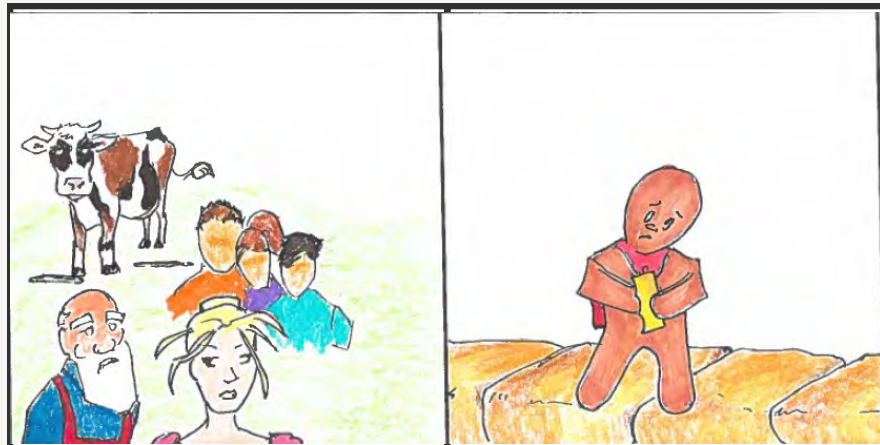
Pgs 21-22

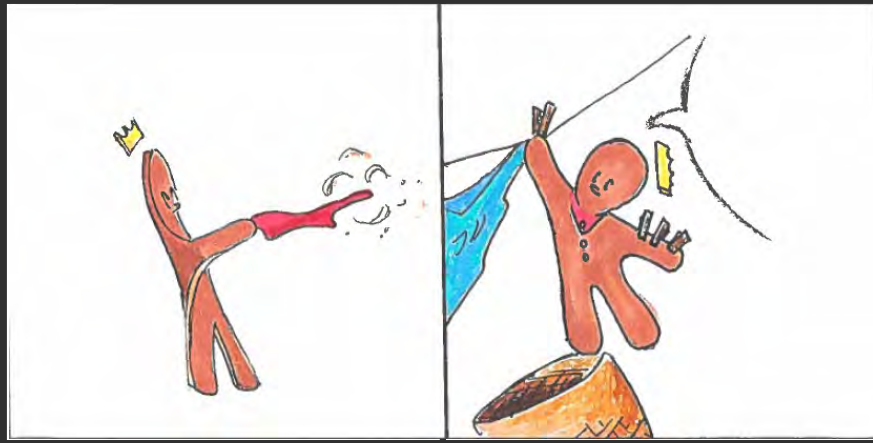


The Prince thought of his mother's three rules: Be kind to others, always have good manners, and always clean up your mess. He had not followed any of these rules today.

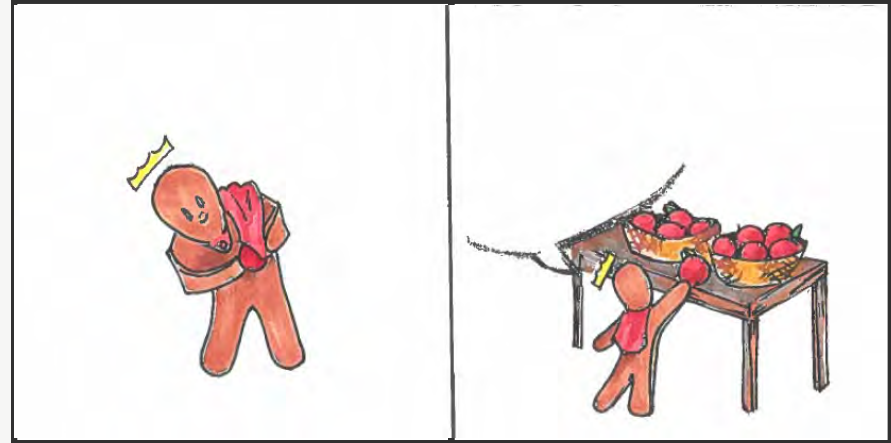
Pgs 29-30



The Prince climbed a tall tree tree by the soccer field. He knocked the ball down from the branches.

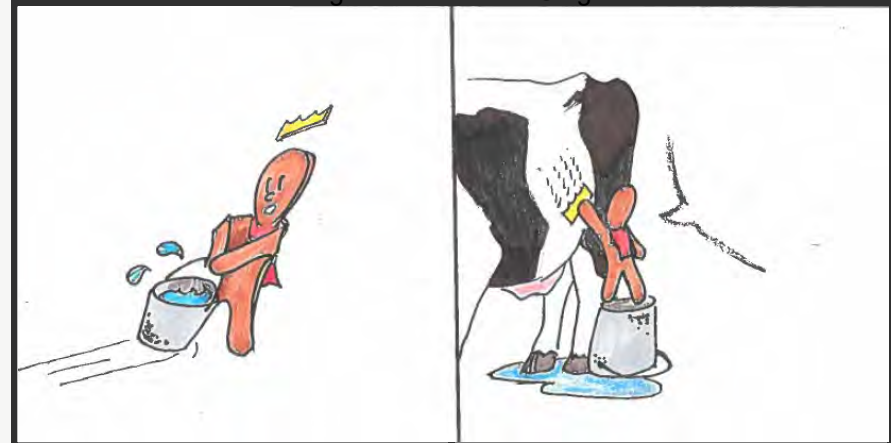
